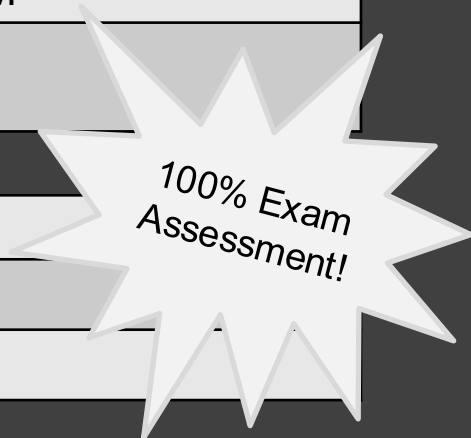

Organise yourself NOW to save yourself LATER

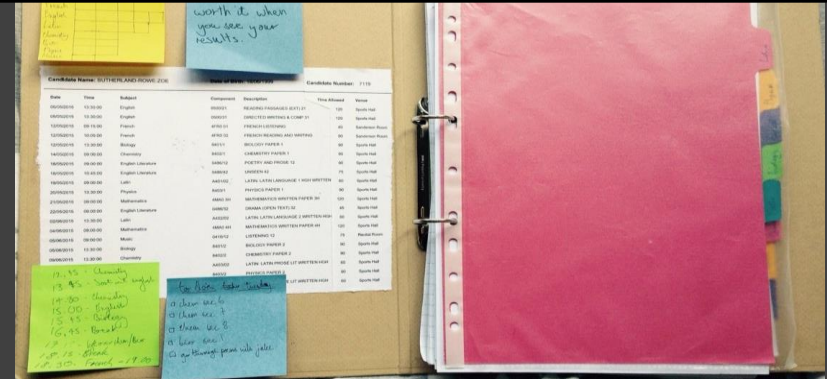
- Use a revision folder

Students should be making revision materials now and should not wait until PPEs to do this. As part of homework activities, you can be creating a bank of the revision resources like the ones displayed on the next slide.

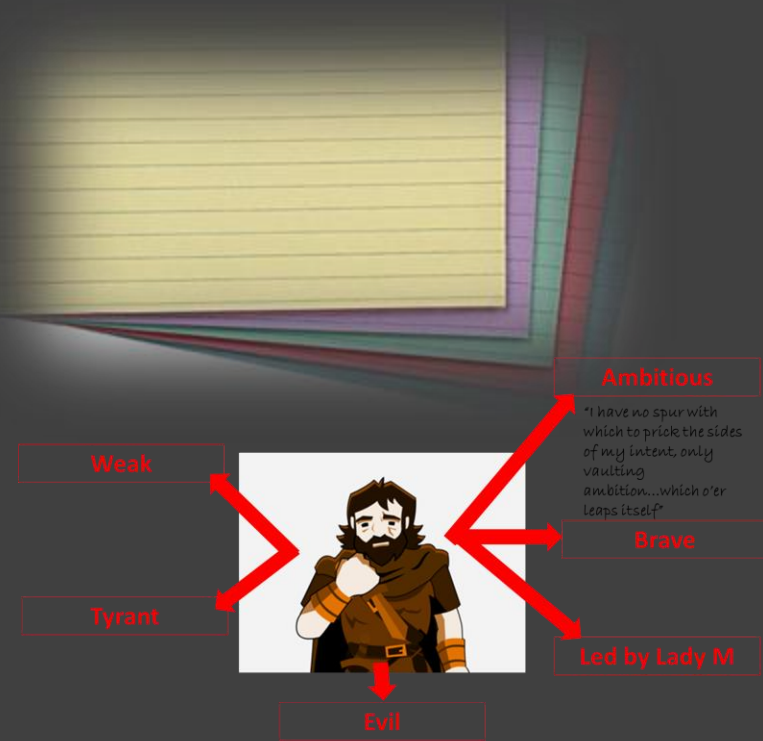
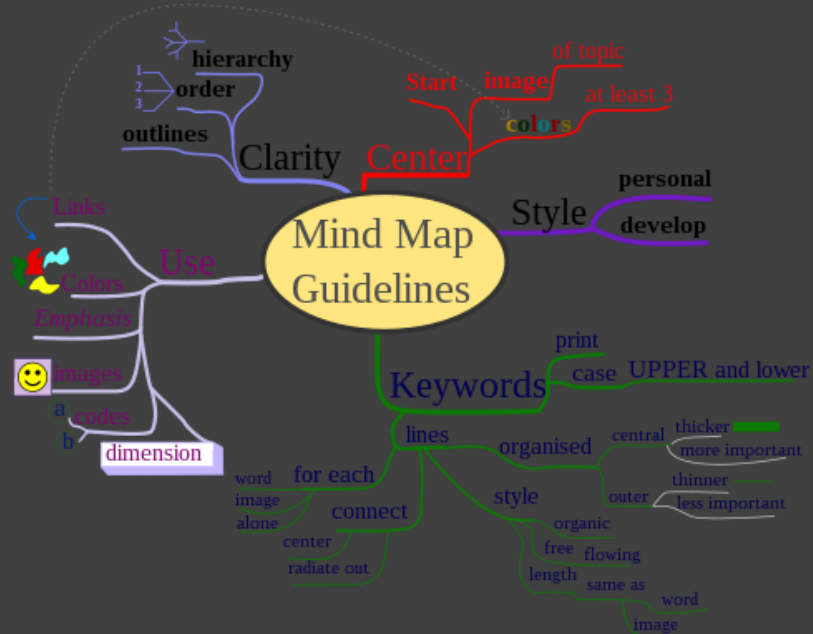
