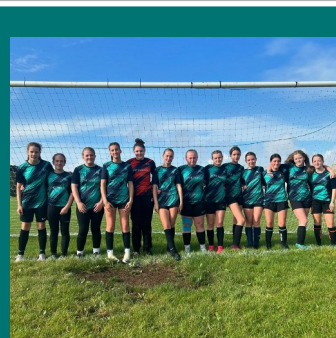

Emma has always worked with children and adults. Her stage training spans drama and song, in PG, residential settings and as a visiting school teacher for many years. She is also the author of five picture books: Goodbye Hobbs and Rufus at Home.
